communications that started. Did he send letters to your office, constant requests?

Well he sent a letter...he wanted his...he wanted the case file and in the line of work that I do, that's not uncommon and I'm okay with an attorney or someone looking at the case file to review something but because of what he was writing, I felt like it was not proper to give him, his ex-wife's medical records and I asked the Court to protect his ex-wife's medical records. I gave him all of his records. I gave him every one of his records, I think twice as a matter of fact and but anything that had to do with his children or his wife, I blacked it out with a black marker and gave him um, the file. Um, but he kept asking for the file. It's almost as if he didn't understand that the Judge said you can't have the file - I'm not saying that - a Judge said it and I believe the Judge said twice, you cannot have the file - you can have your own records and that's it and that's what he got. He sent an anonymous, it's not signed by someone but as a psychologist I look at patterns of behavior and patterns of thought and if there was any pattern to everything that was ever written, this anonymous letter that he wrote, in my opinion, to me is clearly him.
